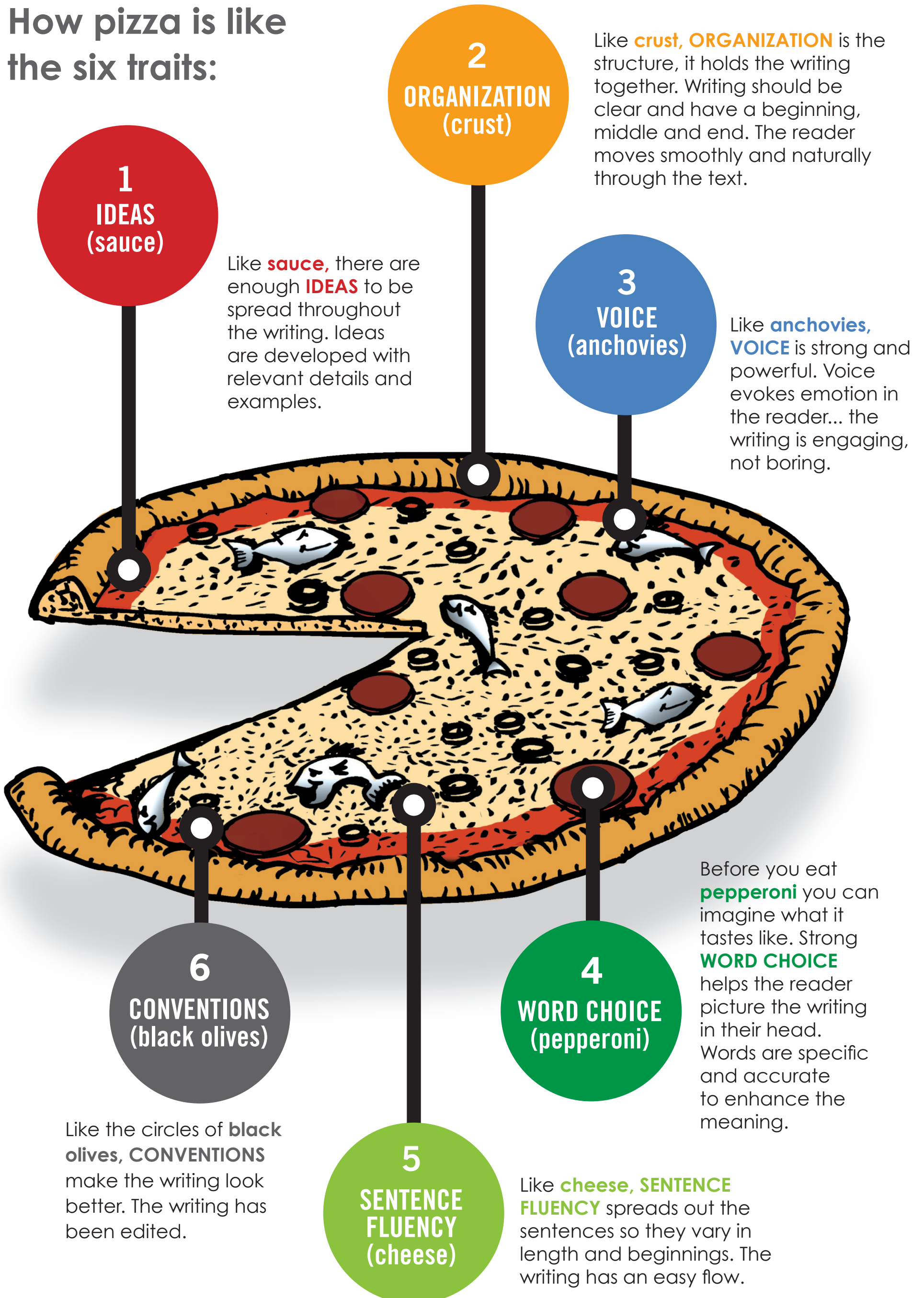
Do
